Safeguarding is the responsibility of Everyone

Wivey Cares recognises that the welfare of vulnerable adults is paramount and that they all, regardless of ability or culture, have equal rights of protection. Wivey Cares has a duty of care and will do everything it can to provide a safe, caring, and secure environment for clients, micro providers and volunteers. Wivey Cares ensures that its policy and any associated policies and procedures and training comply with statutory requirements and reflects available guidance on good practice in safeguarding vulnerable adults, and that safeguarding arrangements are proportionate to the risks involved.

Vulnerable Adult: The definition of vulnerable adult in "Who Decides?' (Lord Chancellor's Office 1997)" and as used in this document is anyone who is over 18 who:

- Is or may be in need of community care services by reason of mental or other disability, age or illness; and
- Is or may be unable to take care of himself or herself; or
- Is unable to protect themselves against significant harm or serious exploitation.

The Safeguarding Officer oversees and ensures that Wivey Care's policy is fully implemented, and that committee members, trustees and volunteers and Micro Providers are fully supported to comply with the Safeguarding Policy. This will include ensuring that volunteers and Micro Providers who have regular contact with vulnerable adults and other senior managers and support staff receive safeguarding training. The DSL will receive and deal with any complaints made against staff in terms of safeguarding.

Safeguarding Procedure

Recognising Types of Abuse and Neglect

There are ten types of abuse: physical, financial or material, psychological or emotional, sexual abuse, neglect and acts of omission, organisational, discriminatory, self-neglect, domestic violence and modern slavery. Reporting Abuse

Where possible support the individual to raise their own concern. Where this is not possible, or the individual does not wish to, seek their consent to raise the concern and explain you are going to report it to the Wivey Cares Safeguarding Officer.

- If the person does not give consent but you are concerned that someone is at immediate risk, it may be necessary to override their wish not to consent. Report the abuse directly to the Somerset Safeguarding team at on 0300 123 2224 (e-mail adults@somerset.gov.uk) during normal working hours. However, if a serious crime has taken place or there is a need for an immediate police response to protect the adult at risk, consider dialling 999.
- Inform the Wivey Cares Safeguarding Officer as soon as is possible.
